



City Overview.

- Fourth largest city in the UK, Sheffield is home to 584,853 people (mid-2019 est.).
- The metropolitan population of Sheffield is 1,569,000 people.
- The local demographic is above the national average for; Lavish Lifestyles, Executive Wealth, Steady Neighbourhoods, Mature Money, Starting Out & Student life.
- The city centre will be the focal point for over two million consumers in 2025.
- 23,400 people live in Sheffield city centre & this figure grows year on year.
- Sheffield city centre has won three national awards for safety & was the first city in the region to be awarded Purple Flag Status.
- Although a city, Sheffield is informally known as "the largest village in England", because of a combination of topographical isolation & demographic stability.

Nature & Green Space.

- A third of the city sits within the Peak District National Park.
- 80 public parks & 650 green & open spaces.
- High Stones on Howden Moor to the west of the city is the highest point within the boundaries of Sheffield & South Yorkshire, measuring 550 metres.
- Over 4.5 million trees makes Sheffield one of England 's greenest cities.
- 61% of Sheffield is made up of green spaces like parks, gardens & countryside.
- 10.91 sq mi / 28.3 km^2 of parks & woodlands.
- 7.07 sq mi / 18.3 km² public parks & gardens.

Transport & Connections.

- The fastest London to Sheffield train service is now just under 2 hours.
- 40min to Doncaster Sheffield Airport from the city centre. Handling upwards of 693,000 passengers & flights to over 40 national & international destinations. It has one of the UK's longest runways & capacity to handle long haul, freight charter, scheduled & business aviation.
- Hallam University has over 1,400 cycle parking spaces at both their main campus & halls of residence.
- HS2 will provide a London to Sheffield service of 87 minutes.
- City centre station location for both HS2 & Northern Powerhouse Rail.
- Doncaster has a highly-integrated supply chain, well-connected infrastructure and is home to more than 50 rail companies.





An exploding food & drink scene.

- Sheffield has a thriving food scene with artisan cafes, impossibly cool independents & innovative restaurants using local produce and drawing inspiration from all continents.
- The street food scene is big in Sheffield with an increasing number of outlets as well as regular evening events that combine pop up artisan fast food, music & art.
- Every year, Sheffield holds its own food festival, showcasing the best traders, restaurants, bars, pubs, pop-ups & local produce suppliers. Over the last couple of years, the food festival has brought over 50,000 people to the city over 3 days at the end of May, with over £1 million being spent during the weekend.
- Coffee shop culture is rife, filling the pavements in the city centre & surrounding areas.
- There are only 28 seats in Sheffield's smallest bar: Public. Formerly a men's lavatory in the centre of Sheffield, now one of Sheffield's coolest bars, collecting the Guardian's OFM Award: Best Place to Drink in 2018.
- Sheffield is famous for 2 exports: Steel & Beer (Steelwork is thirsty work afterall!).
 A number of pubs dating back to the area's mid-19th-century industrial peak still stand & Kelham Island's real ale trail will show you the best.
- Kommune at Castle House brings together some of the most exciting independent kitchens for a social all-day dining experience.

Culture in the city (2019).

- Shepherd Wheel in Sheffield is the city's last surviving water-powered knifegrinding workshop.
- Sheffield has been famous for it's excellent knives since the reign of Richard I.
- Sheffield's got one of the biggest art scenes outside London, with countless galleries & studios you can visit for free like the Millennium Gallery & Site Gallery in the city centre.
- The Millennium Gallery is the most visited free attraction in the North of England & houses a stunning collection of city artefacts & 20th Century British Art.
- £1m turnover per annum from Sheffield's artists' studios.
- 19 Studio groups provide 362 artists with studios.
- 362 artists across 19 studio groups.
- 100's free literary talks every October at Off the Shelf Festival.
- Sheffield doc/fest documentary film festival is one of the biggest in the industry, attracting top filmmakers from around the world & over 25,000 festival goers.
- Located in one of the city's oldest industrial districts, Kelham Island museum stands on a man-made island over 900 years old, to house the objects, pictures & archive materials representing Sheffield's industrial story.
- Kelham Island Museum is home to the River Don Engine that continues to run on steam & is the most powerful working steam engine remaining in Europe today.
- Tramlines is Sheffield's biggest party, with tens of thousands of music fans taking the 15-minute tram from the city centre to watch over 70 acts across four stages at Hillsborough Park.

- Crucible's famous modern theatre is home to world-class productions.
 The epic stage is surrounded by seats on three sides, meaning you're never more than 20 metres from the action.

- 1000's of film makers attracted to the city annual International Documentary Film Festival (every June). The third largest festival in the world.
- Studio Theatre flexes from 100 to 400 seats & welcomes top treats from the fringe, local heroes & new treasures.





- Before their gig in 2005, Arcade Fire were told by Franz Ferdinand that "Playing The Leadmill is a rite of passage for any band worth their salt."
- 465 bands & artists, 65 recording studios, 69 venues that host live music & home to 24 recording labels.
- Sheffield has music pedigree in its veins, producing artists such as: The Arctic Monkeys, Pulp, Heaven17, Human League, ABC, Babybird, Bring me the Horizon, Def Leppard, Richard Hawley, Bruce Dickinson, Moloko, Reverend & the Makers, Toddla T, Paul Carrack, & Tony Christie.


